

- Expanded the Beach Sweeps program, which for over 25 years has improved and protected the quality of the shoreline and educated tens of thousands of citizens.

Waves of Action: A Long-Term Strategy

- ForTheShore.org.** In partnership with organizations from across New York and New Jersey, members of the community are asked to coordinate relief projects in the form of Waves of Action days. They will progress with the needs of communities and will keep the momentum going for continued improvement of the shore through debris clean ups, sustainable development plans, and projects to improve water quality.
- Protect and Improve Water Quality. COA will work to ensure that the impacts of billions of gallons of raw sewage, oil, and chemicals will be assessed and addressed, making waters safe for swimming and marine life.
- Restore Communities: Going Green to Save Big Blue. A common vision is essential in ensuring progress with the long-term challenges that the region faces. COA is collaborating with leaders from throughout the state and, as rebuilding moves forward, will work to ensure sensible, sustainable, and resilient communities that adapt and maintain their unique coastal culture.
- Clean Ocean Zone. While the NY & NJ coast lies shattered, it is particularly vulnerable to ocean industrialization from LNG and oil and gas exploration and development. COA will continue to work toward keeping our ocean wild and free from harmful industry.
