# Positive Changes to Reef Application Retains Program Integrity Position of Coalition Affirmed

**Sandy Hook-** Today, Clean Ocean Action (COA) sent a letter to the US Army Corps of Engineers, Philadelphia District, (ACOE) acknowledging and praising the positive, swift federal and state actions to fix the substantial issues with a recent application for artificial reef sites off the Jersey Shore. The letter also clarified misinterpretations.

In January 2005, COA submitted detailed comments to the ACOE responding to New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's application for a 5-year permit to manage 15 artificial reef sites. Of concern were three issues where the state application was inconsistent and incomplete. COA requested that these issues be addressed and that failure to address the issues would require the application be denied. This letter prompted some to misinterpret the comment letter to suggest opposition to the reef program

The letter signed by Cindy Zipf, Executive Director, COA, to Lt. Colonel Robert Ruch, states in part, "COA is delighted that swift progress is being made to address the deficiencies in the application." In addition the letter states, "In no way should COA comments be construed as opposing the reef program."

"COA has always supported NJ's Artificial Reef program, its expansion, and its status as one of the best in the country, and our comments were submitted to uphold the status of the program," said, Cindy Zipf, Executive Director of COA.

The significant actions to address these concerns included the following:

- 1. NJ Division of Fish & Wildlife, held a meeting on January 27<sup>th</sup> (10 days after the comment letter was submitted) with representatives from COA, American Littoral Society, Recreational Fishing Alliance, and Jersey Coast Anglers Association to discuss the permit application. The State concurred that the application was inconsistent with State policy. The meeting focused on expediting actions to address the inconsistencies to assure permit approval. The meeting resulted in a letter from the state to the ACOE to that effect.
- 2. The Endangered Species Act consultation has now been considered and the National Marine Fisheries Service has concluded that the project will not affect any listed species, such as sea turtles.
- 3. NJDEP Land Use Regulation Program is preparing the documents required for federal consistency determination.
